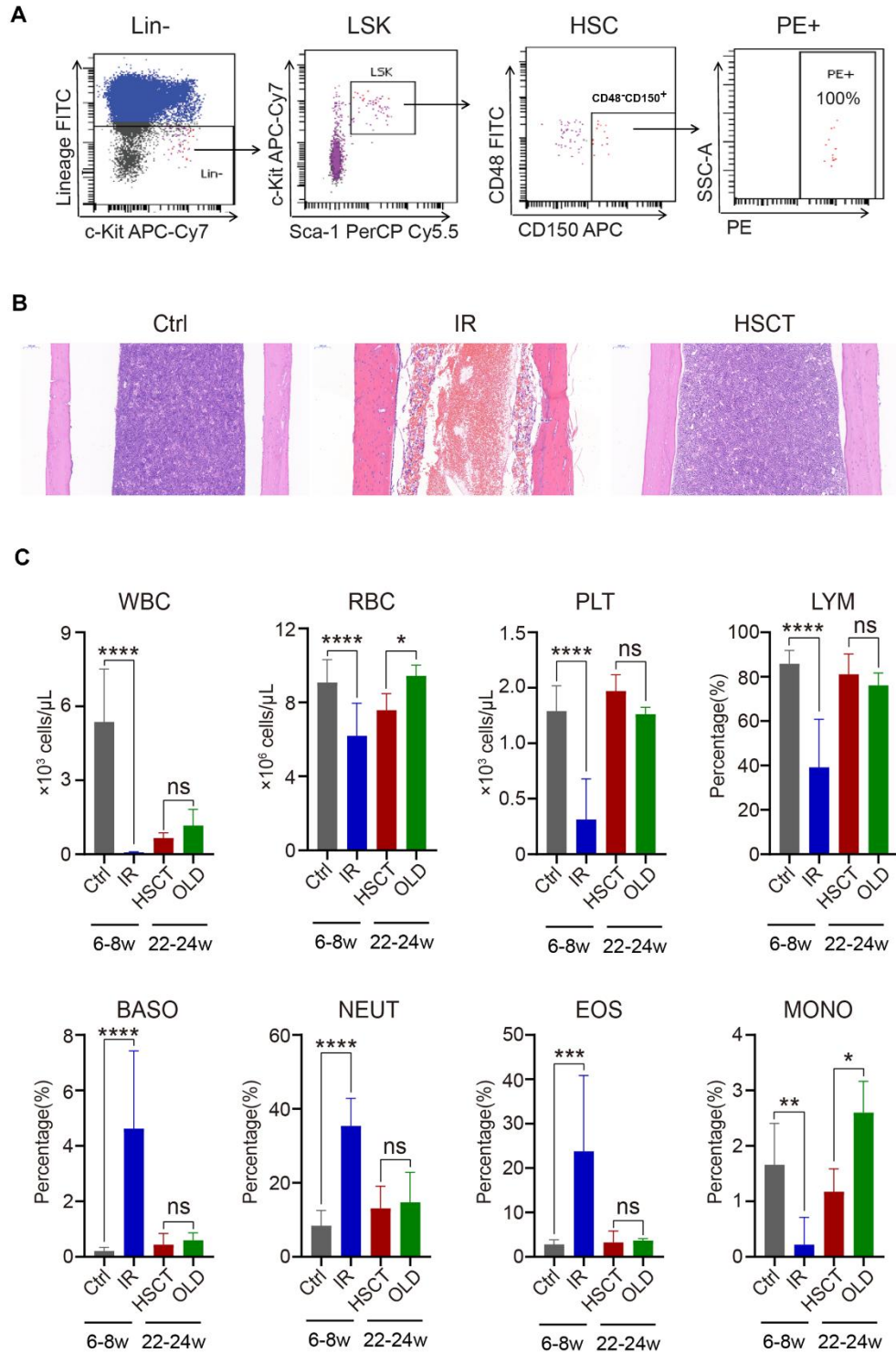
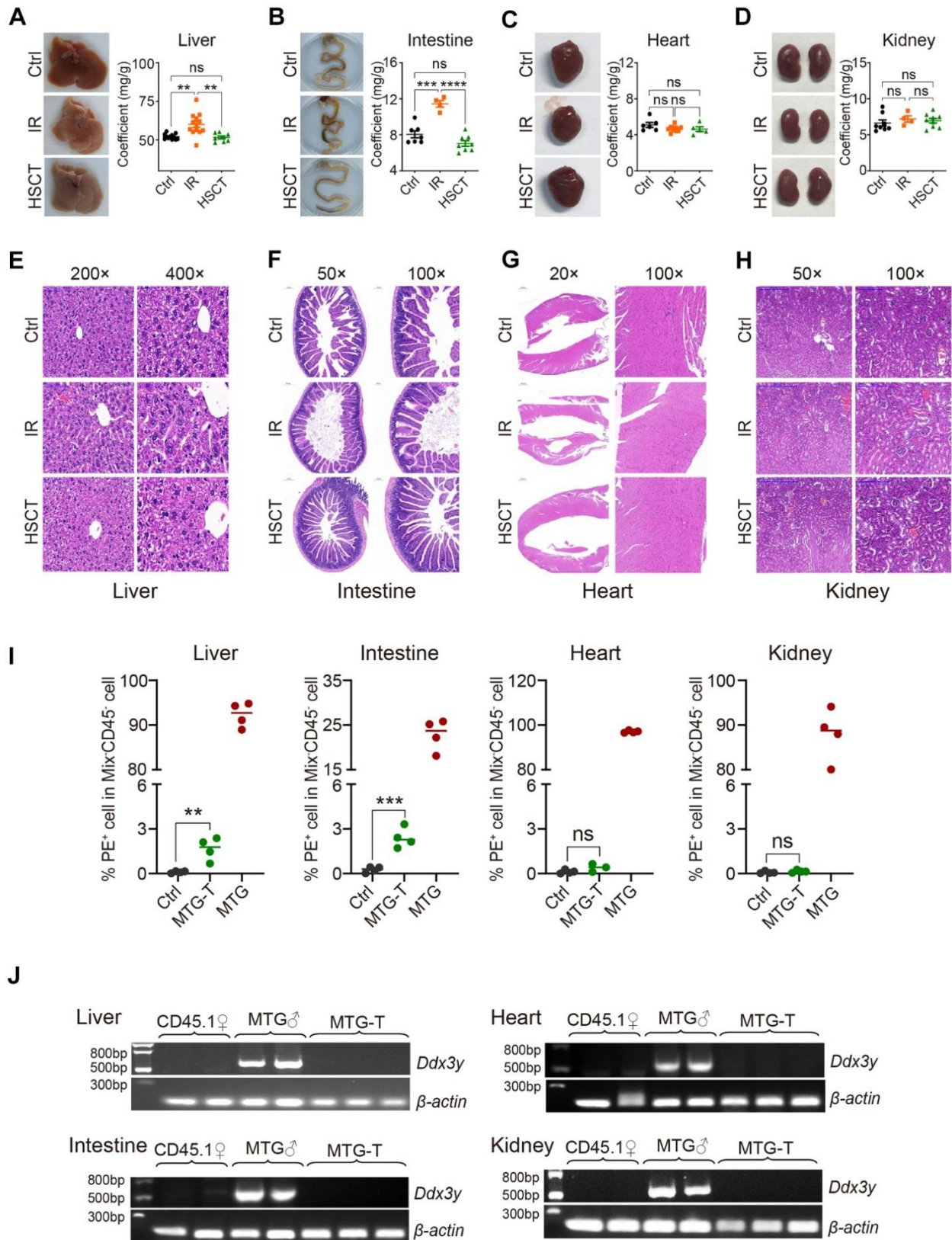


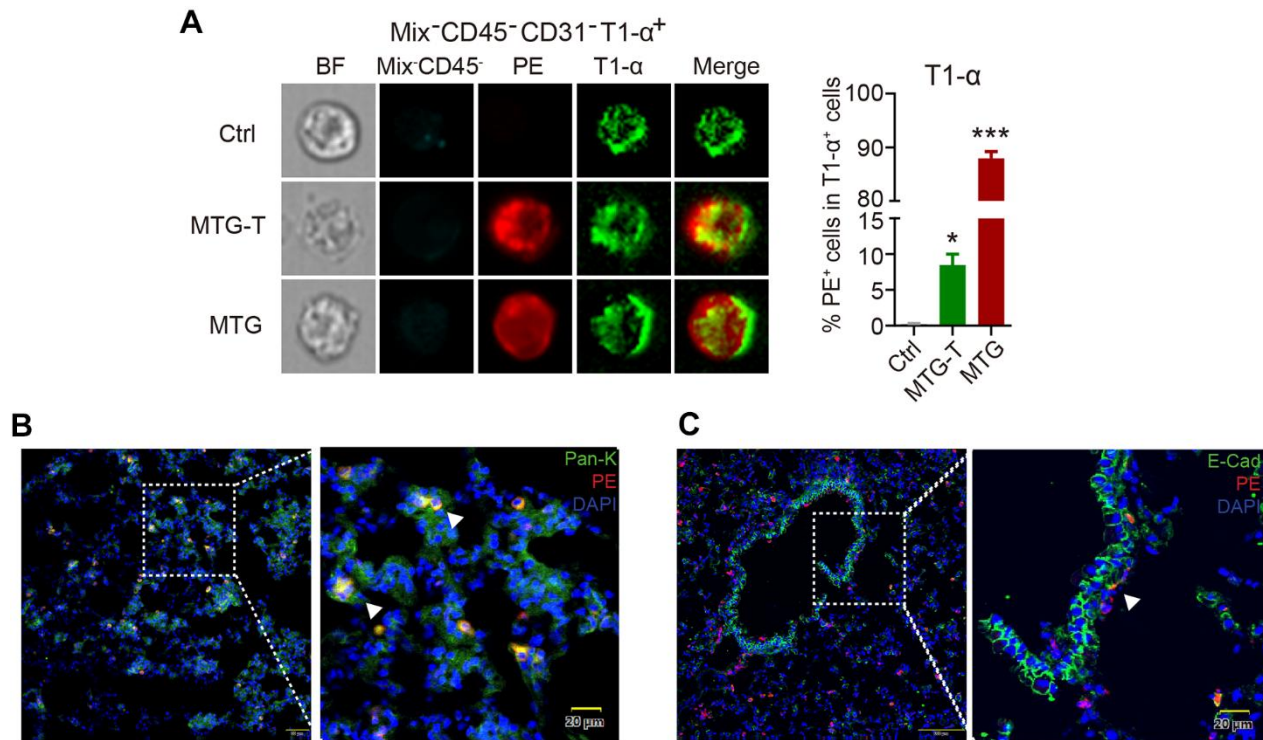

Supplementary Figure 1. PE red fluorescence in donor HSCs and HSCT regenerated the hematopoiesis in the irradiated mice. (A) PE red fluorescence in HSC of donor Rosa^{MT/MG} mice. (B) HSCT recovered the bone marrow injury induced by irradiation in HE pathology. (C) HSCT regenerated the peripheral blood cells including WBC (white blood cells), RBC (red blood cells), PLT (platelets), LYM (lymphocytes), BASO (basophilic granulocytes), NEUT (neutrophil granulocytes), EOS (eosinophilic granulocytes) and MONO (monocytes). N≥4. *: p<0.05; **:p<0.01; ***: p<0.001; ****: p<0.0001.



Supplementary Figure 2. HSCT repaired the tissue injury but not through trans-differentiation. (A–D) The tissue appearance and coefficient including liver, intestine, heart and kidney in each group.
